



God ons Vader



This resurrection life you received from God is not a timid, grave-tending life. It's adventurously expectant, greeting God with a childlike "What's next, Papa?"




God's spirit touches our spirits and




If we go through the hard times with him, then we're certainly going to go through the good times with him! That's why I don't think there's any comparison between the present hard times and the coming good times.

creation is being more or less held back.





within us.


Romans 8:21-22

yearning for full deliverance.





If we don't know how or what to pray, it doesn't matter. He does our praying in and for us, making prayer out of our wordless sighs, our aching groans.



He knows us far better than we know ourselves, knows our pregnant condition, and keeps us present before God.



That's why we can be so sure that every detail in our lives of love for God is worked into something good.




God knew what he was doing from the very beginning. He decided from the outset to shape the lives of those who love him along the same lines as the life of his Son.




After he called them by name, he set them on a solid basis with himself. And then, after getting them established, he stayed with them to the end, gloriously completing what he had begun.




The one who died for us—who was raised to life for us!—is in the presence of God at this very moment sticking up for us.


We're sitting ducks; they pick us off one by one. None of this fazes us because Jesus loves us.




